



THE CALL OF GRENOBLE


FOR AN "IPCC ON ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH"

Réseau Environnement Santé (RES) is a French NGO with a mission in Environmental Health. RES successfully lobbied for the EU-wide ban of BPA in baby bottles and is also credited with the creation of the French national plan on endocrine disruptors (SNPE). Together with the **City of Grenoble, labeled "2022 European Green Capital"**, RES are organising an international meeting marking the 30th anniversary of the Wingspread Conference, during which the notion of **"endocrine disruptors"** came to public life. This meeting will bring together international scientists, NGOs, policy makers and will be broadcast live all day on March 19th 2022.

Similarly to how the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has mobilised various scientific disciplines in order to raise public awareness of the climate crisis, this meeting will be an opportunity to call for the creation of an "IPCC on Environmental Health". Its goal would be to gather scientific knowledge across the board and prepare for the "Zero pollution by 2050" objective of the European Green Deal.

The covid crisis just highlighted the **relevance of the Global Health concept** and how urgent it is to tackle background, **environmental, factors** in the spread of chronic diseases –which in turn have proved a fertile ground for the current virus.
